Who are we?

The Centre for Youth Health delivers health services for young people aged 12-24 years living in Counties Manukau. Our multi-disciplinary team includes nurses, doctors, social workers, youth health workers and other professionals. Our service aims to promote the wellbeing and healthy development of young people in the context of their family/whaanau, culture and wider environment.

We support young people through a range of clinical services, advocacy, education and training, research and leadership.

What services do we offer?

Youth Health Services:

We offer the following clinical services:

- Specialist Adolescent Clinics (SAC) for young people with chronic or complex health issues
- Weekly health clinics at Alternative
 Education programmes
- Support for young people who are gender diverse or exploring their gender identity

Education and Training:

We provide professional education and training, including a range of workshops for people working with youth.

Youth Health Information Service:

Provides resources and support for health professionals and community organisations working in youth health.

Who do we see?

We accept referrals for young people with psychosocially complicated medical or youth development concerns.

These include:

- Chronic illness/disabilities
- Developmental concerns,
- Psychosomatic health issues
- High risk health behaviours

Referrals are received from anyone, including health professionals, schools, families and young people.

We do not routinely accept referrals where the only concern is:

- Psychiatric disorders or suicidal intent
- Substance-use disorders
- Educational or learning concerns

We are happy to discuss any possible referrals or youth health concerns.
