WHAT WE DO

Kainga Ora is a free service which aims to support low income families to have warmer, drier and healthier homes. We deliver interventions through a mixture of work and social interagency collaboration. We provide education on a healthy home, assistance with Full and Correct Entitlement Assessment (FACE) and support with Social Housing Applications (with fast tracking). We can also help with interventions in the home including insulation, ventilation, heating, curtains, carpets and bedding—HNZ and private rentals. Some minor repairs can also be done, for example, broken windows frames and window latches, draught stopping and smoke alarm installation.

OUR SUCCESS STORIES

- 100/314 have got new public housing and a further 136 families have been added to the public housing waiting list (with 78 applications still in process)
- 51 others have moved into new **Private Rentals**
- 117/241 received new curtains
- 205/433 minor repairs work completed (HNZ/ Private Rentals)

Mum is working full time, Dad is unwell and can't work. The whanau have 3 older children with rheumatic fever and 2 younger children placed in their care. They have been living in a private rental home for 10 years and paying a rent of \$515 per week. The house is in very poor condition and has had limited maintenance completed in the last decade. The ceilings are high without insulation and have plastic roofing. Family is not eligible for social housing and they did not want to move because they cannot afford higher rent. Now...

The home was detrimental to the children's health so our social workers have assisted the family to find a brand new 5-bedroom private rental which they can afford. The family were able to stay together as was their wish. Their WINZ benefits were increased as a result of the Kainga Ora assessment. The original house is currently under investigation with the MBIE.
