Service Provision

We are a multi-disciplinary team. Our service offers assessment and treatment for people:

- Aged 65 years and older living in our community with suspected significant mental illness presenting in later life.
- Aged 65 years and older, with dementia, who present with clinically significant challenging b) behaviour and/or psychological symptoms. Exceptions will be made on a case by case basis for people under the age of 65, with a focus on people who identify as Maori or Pacific Islander.

We provide predominately a community based service. We have two speciality beds for the Elderly on the Acute Psychiatric Inpatient Unit, Te Whare Oranga Tangata Whakaue. It may sometimes be necessary to utilise the Mental Health Act (MHA) to facilitate an admission. It is advisable to discuss use of the MHA with the Duty Psychiatrist or Acute Response Team, ART.

Referral Information

The following information expedites triaging of new referrals and may rule out possible underlying causes:

- Reason for referral, including significance of clinical presentation and risk factors (e.g. Unsafe driving; Unsafe wandering; Elder abuse, neglect or exploitation; Risk of Assault or Suicide)
- Consent to treatment (by EPOA if appointed / discussion with family if appropriate)
- Diagnostic & Treatment history of mental illness or cognitive impairment
- List of current medication
- Results of recent urine or blood tests: FBC, U/E, LFT, TSH, Calcium, B12/folate, Glucose, HbA1c, (fasting) Lipids, Electrolyte & Creatinine
- Baseline metabolic screening: BP, Weight, Height and Girth (if possible)
- Any previous or current cognitive testing (GPCOG or other)
- Results of ECG if done / indicated
- Any relevant physical and neurological examinations
